Inter-institutional agreement 2022/2023-2027/2028

The institutions agree to cooperate for the exchange of students and/or staff in the context of the Swiss-European Mobility Programme SEMP. They commit to respect the quality requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education in all aspects related to the organisation and management of the mobility with the supplement that SEMP promotes both, outgoing mobility to programme destinations as well as incoming mobility from these countries to Switzerland, financially. Should the current status of Switzerland or of the respective partner change with regard to Erasmus+/follow-up programme, the regulations will be adjusted and partners informed in due time.

The partners commit to amend the table below in case of changes in the mobility data by no later than the 1st of December in the preceding academic year.


